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MINUTES OF THE 91ST MEETING OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF KVS HELD AT 3.30 P.M ON 19TH JANUARY, 2012 IN THE CONFERENCE HALL, ROOM NO.112, 'C' WING, SHASTRI BHAWAN, NEW DELHI.

The 91st meeting of the Board of Governors of Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) was held on 19th January, 2012 at 3.30 P.M in Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi under the chairmanship of Shri Kapil Sibal, Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development & Chairman, KVS. Commissioner, KVS welcomed Hon'ble HRM & Chairman, KVS and other distinguished members of the Board. Thereafter, agenda items listed for deliberations were taken up by the Commissioner, KVS one by one through a power point presentation for consideration of the Board.

TO CONSIDER AND APPROVE THE REVISED ESTIMATES FOR 2011-12 AND BUDGET ESTIMATES 2012-13.

The proposal of KVS seeking funds for Rs. 2293.70 crore in RE 2011-12 and Rs. 2539.75 crore in BE 2012-13 under Non-Plan and Rs. 822 crore for RE 2011-12 and 1314.03 crore in BE 2012-13 under Plan has been examined by the Finance Committee and recommended to the BOG for its approval.

ITEM NO. 6(6):

CLEARANCE OF OUTSTANDING DUES ON ACCOUNT OF ELECTRICITY/MAINTENANCE CHARGES IN R/O KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA C.C.I. BOKAJAN.

Kendriya Vidyalaya C.C.I. Bokajan was opened under Project Sector in the year 1986-87 under certain terms & conditions which inter-alia provide the responsibility of the Sponsoring Agency for bearing the total Recurring & Non-recurring expenditure. During the year 2010, the C.C.I. authorities started Non-remittance of adequate funds. Consequently the electricity and water charges were not paid by the CCI.

The Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan filed writ petition before the Hon'ble HighCourt Guwahati seeking direction for payment of the outstanding & current dues incurred by the Sangathan. In the counter affidavit the CCI authorities broadly agreed that the amounts are due to KVS but dispute remained over the quantum of expenses incurred by KVS as well as transparency in the accounts of expenditure.

The Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 3.9.2010 directed for exploring the possibility of an out of Court settlement.

Thereafter on 24.09.2010 a joint resolution was passed by the authorities of CCI Bokajan and KVS RO Silchar wherein it was resolved to explore that release of outstanding dues to KVS and economy in current expenditure of KV Bokajan. Consequently on 30.9.2010 the C.C.I. authorities vide their letter dated 30.09.2010 conveyed to KVS that they will increase the monthly grant aid for smooth running of the School and KVS will also curtail all the unproductive expenditure.

Regarding electricity bill para (iii) of the letter speaks as under:-

CCI will start raising the electricity bill from the financial year 2010-11 which was earlier being provided by CCI free of cost for lighting entire Building and surrounding area by spending around 2.50 lacs to 3.00 lacs per year which henceforth will be permitted to pay from VVN fund.

The CCI authorities vide their last communication dated 23.4.2011 have conveyed that the bill for Rs.1.5 lac which will be raised is towards electricity and maintenance charges. The Deputy Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan Regional Office, Silchar vide their letter dated 5.5.2011 has also conveyed to KVS (HQ) that Rs. 1.5 lac towards electricity and

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maintenance charges per year is acceptable and has sought the approval of the Competent Authority for the said expenditure out of VVN.

Hence to settle the dispute, with an understanding of Sponsoring Agency as well as KVS an expenditure of Rs. 1.5 lac per annum towards electricity and maintenance charges from VVN in the matter KV CCI Bokajan only is proposed to be approved by the Finance Committee, KVS.

The issue of payment of Rs. 1.5 lakh per year towards electricity and maintenance charges out of VVN account of the Kendriya Vidyalaya, CCI, Bokajan to the Project Authority as per the implementation of the order of Hon'ble High Court, Guwahati has been considered by the Finance Committee and recommended the same for the approval of BOG.

ITEM NO. 6(7):

EXPENDITURE OF OUTSOURCING OF INTERNAL AUDIT OF KVs UNDER 5 REGIONS.

- The proposal of making payment of Rs. 51,15,758/- over and above the budget allocation of Rs. 45 lakh to All India Council of Audit and Accountants (AICAA), New Delhi towards the expenditure for outsourcing of Internal Audit of 316 KVs located in the five regions has been considered by the Finance Committee and recommended to the BOG for its approval for the total expenditure of Rs. 51,15, 758/- so as to make the payment to AICAA, New Delhi.

ITEM NO. 6(8)

SHORTAGE OF FUNDS FOR KVS CONSTRUCTION WORKS.

The matter regarding of acute shortage of funds for KVS construction work has been discussed by the Finance Committee and advised to explore the possibility for providing additional funds from the surplus funds etc. of other divisions.

ITEM 6(9):

INCURRING OF CONTINGENCY EXPENDITURE OUT OF SCHOOL FUND.

The Finance Committee desired to further examine the issue in greater detail and to identify such expenditures to be excluded from VVN and as such the matter is deferred.

SUPPLEMENTARY ITEM NO. 6(1):

DISPOSAL OF E-WASTE IN KVS.

KVS has gone a long way in creating an infrastructure in field of ICT in last ten years. Every year we are adding into it. However by the passage of time we have reached to a situation where some of our PCs will be completing their life and will become obsolete technology wise.

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In the light of above it is being proposed that:-

- 1. KVS may dispose our E-Waste (like PCs, Fax, Telephone, CPU, UPS etc.) as per E-Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 2011 coming to effect from 1 May, 2012.
- For PCs which are now obsolete and are to be replaced with advance version of technologies may be offered as donation to some first time user village schools from various State Govt. This programme can be integrated with the extension of service performance of KVS to State Govt. School.

The Sangathan proposed for disposal of e-waste such as PCs, fax, telephones, CPU, UPS etc. in terms of the provisions contained in the new rules e-waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 2011 taking effect from 1st May, 2012. It is also proposed to replace the obsolete PC's with advanced version of technology and to offer the obsolete PCs as donation to the first time user village schools of various State Governments. With this proposal, it is possible to integrate this program with the extension of service performance of KVS to State Government Schools.

The matter was considered by the Finance Committee and recommended for approval of BOG of Sangathan.

SUPPLEMENTARY ITEM NO. 6(2):

CONDEMNATION OF STORES – DELEGATION OF POWERS AT VARIOUS LEVELS IN KVS

In view of the above the proposals at (a) and (b) below are submitted for consideration of the Finance Committee:

a) The powers of condemnation of articles of stores including the IT equipment's purchased out of VVN/School Fund account at various levels of KVS may be revised as under:

b) In the matter of condemnation of IT equipments the procedure prescribed vide circular No. F. 110240/(6)/2009-KVS (HQ)/Budget dated 26.08.2009 will remain unchanged.

The delegation of powers at various levels proposed by the KVS for condemnation of stores including the IT equipments purchased out of VVN and School Fund Accounts has been considered by the Finance Committee and recommended the said proposal to the BOG of KVS for approval.

ITEM NO.7: SETTING UP OF KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS IN CIVIL SECTOR UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS.

The Board did not agree to the proposal for enhancement of lease rent of Rs. 1000/-per acre subject to a minimum of Rs. 5000/- per annum in respect of Ministry of Railways as it would lead to disparity with other departments. The Board directed KVS to take up the matter with Ministry of Railways to continue to provide suitable piece of the land free of cost at a nominal lease rent i.e. @ Re. 1/- per annum for construction of permanent vidyalaya building.

ITEM NO.8: PROPOSAL FOR OPENING OF NEW KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS UNDER CIVIL SECTOR- INCLUSION OF 04 MORE NEW LOCATIONS AMONG OTHER FEASIBLE PROPOSALS.

The B.O.G approved opening of new Kendriya Vidyalayas at the following four feasible locations with the remarks that Vyas Nagar Distt. Jajpur at Sr.No.3 may be read as Byas Nagar, Jajpur.

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ITEM NO.9: INTRODUCTION OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS RUNNING UNDER PROJECT SECTOR AND INSTITUTE OF HIGHER LEARNING.

The Board reviewed its decision taken in the 77th meeting held on 20.06.2007 regarding introduction of fresh MOU for Kendriya Vidyalayas running under Project Sector and Institute of Higher Learning and decided as under:

- In the matter of new KVs opened after decision of the BOG dated 20.06.2007 and likely to be opened in future, the provisions of the MOU circulated vide KVS circular dated 01.08.2007 may be enforced in its totality. A copy of MOU proforma is placed at APPENDIX-D (Pages 21 -25)
- 2. In the matter of the KVs opened prior to 20.06.2007 under IHL/Project Sector, such KVs may be exempted from filling the MOU afresh.

ITEM NO.10: MAINTENANCE AND PREPARATION OF ANNUAL PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT REPORTS—COMMUNICATION OF ALL ENTRIES FOR FAIRNESS AND TRANSPARENCY IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION.

The proposal was approved that there would be two awards each for the special category teachers of the Primary and the Secondary respectively and one award for the non teaching category in the KVS National Incentive Award. Similarly one award each would be for the special category teachers of Primary (including PRT Music and, H.M) and Secondary teachers including PGTs/TGTs/Principal/Vice Principal/Misc. category teachers and one from non teaching category respectively for the Regional Incentive Awards. The details are given below:

Further, an expenditure of Rs. 3,20,000/-(Three lakhs twenty thousand only) may be incurred by the KVS. Break up is as follows:

- 1. KVS Incentive Awards 5 X Rs. 10,000=Rs. 50,000 (fifty thousand only)
- 2. Regional Incentive Awards 18X3XRs. 5000 = Rs. 2,70,000/-(Two lakhs seventy thousand only)

SUPPL. ITEM NO.1(7):

EFC MEMO FOR OPENING OF KVs IN PPP MODE IN DISTRICTS NOT HAVING KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS IN CIVIL SECTOR.

It was felt that PPP model was not in keeping with the mandate of KVS. Opening of KVs has been aimed at providing education to wards of transferable Central Government Employees including defence personnels. Dilution of this mandate cannot be accepted. Therefore, the AAC did not recommend the introduction of the scheme of opening of new KVs under the PPP mode.

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SUPPL. ITEM NO.1(SUPPL. ITEM NO.1):

REVIEW OF VIDYALAYA TIME TABLE, STAFFING NORMS AND WORK ALLOCATION TO TEACHERS IN VIEW OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISION OF RTE AND CCE.

The Committee approved the recommendations as given below:

- As per the recommendations of RTE Act 2009, the teacher-student ratio in Primary and Upper Primary is to be maintained as 1:40 and 1:35 respectively. Therefore in KV's wherever average enrolment in primary and secondary (to be taken as two separate units) exceeds 50, teachers may be appointed on contract basis with provision to pay out of school fund.
- 2. RTE Act 2009 envisages 45 hrs of work per week. i.e. 7 hrs. 30 mts. per day. This includes planning/ preparation/checking and other follow up work. School functions for 6 hrs. 10 mts. Therefore teachers may be retained after school hours for additional 1 hour 20 minutes which can be used for planning/ preparation/ checking/follow up work and for ensuring safe arrival and exit of students before and after school hours.
- 3. 08 period time table may be followed in KVs with 45 mts. duration in the 1st and fifth periods and 40 mts. duration for the remaining (**Model time table placed at Appendix- G (Page-33)**.
- 4. Number of periods may be 07 each for both English and Hindi for classes VI to X. For Primary Section, the number of periods allotted will be 8 each for English and Hindi. Periods for developing proficiency in spoken language will be carved out from periods allotted for the respective languages.
- 5. Wherever a Foreign Language is offered in lieu of Sanskrit, periods as allotted to Sanskrit will be utilized to teach the respective foreign language.
- 6. Of the 7/8/8 periods allotted for Maths for classes VI to VIII/ IX/ X, 01 period is to be earmarked separately for Maths Lab activity.
- 7. Of the 6/7/7 periods allotted for Science for classes VI to VIII/IX/ X, 01 period is to be earmarked separately for Lab activity. For classes XI & XII, 09 periods are allotted for all Elective Subjects with the break up of 5(Theory)+4(practicals) for subjects involving practicals. One batch for practicals may comprise of 20-25 students.
- 8. 02 periods each per week be allotted for WET and ART EDUCATION for classes I to X.
- 9. 01 library period for class X be allotted by shifting 01 period from Games/Yoga i.e. class X will have 03 periods for games/Yoga instead of 04.
- 10. One period for Work Experience will be allotted during school hours itself for classes XI and XII by allotting a period from Games/Yoga periods.
- 11. 01 period is to be allotted for CCA in all classes from I to XII. In case 01 period is insufficient for CCA activities, a zero period is to be framed to conduct the activities effectively.
- 12. RTE 2009 envisages one full time Head Teacher for the classes VI --VIII. It is recommended that one V.P. post may be sanctioned in all the KVs having classes up to XII irrespective of strength. V.P. in these schools will also act as Head Teacher for Upper Primary. In case of schools with 03 to 04 sections one more V.P. post may be sanctioned. In case of schools with 05 sections or more, three V.P. posts may be sanctioned to meet the requirement of proper monitoring supervision and accountability. The responsibilities of the existing V.P. may be defined in such a way as to enable him/her to work as Head Teacher for Upper Primary.
- 13. Wherever PGTs don't fulfill their requisite/allotted quota of periods in Secondary/Sr. secondary sections, the balance periods will be adjusted

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- by allotting periods in the upper primary classes in the interest of students and the institution.
- 14. Wherever TGT (Sanskrit) teachers don't fulfill their requisite/allotted quota of periods in Upper Primary & Secondary Sections the balance periods will be adjusted by allotting teaching periods of Hindi.
- 15. CCE warrants more time for the teachers during class room activities. Therefore 2 block periods per subject per week to be planned in the time table of primary & secondary classes.

Regarding recommendation No. 12 the Committee in principle approved the proposal with recommendation that it should also be examined in the Finance Committee where full financial implication should be presented and considered.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS DISCUSSED (1) VOCATIONAL EDUCATION IN KVs.

It was suggested that KVS should associate with National Vocational Education Qualification Framework (NVEQF) programme as this would benefit students. The NVEQF programme will be integrated with mainstream education which would provide an alternative Vocation based education to students.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS DISCUSSED (2) REVIEW OF PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED TEACHERS.

KVS is following the Govt. policy for the recruitment of Physically Handicapped (PH) teachers. However, in particular subjects like Maths it has been reported by Principals that Visually Impaired teachers are not able to cope and are not effective.

The AAC recommended that a Committee may be constituted to study this issue and to come up with suggestions to make their teaching more effective.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS DISCUSSED (3) TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAMMES IN ENGLISH IN COLLABORATION WITH EFLU, HYDERABAD.

KVS has been associating with EFLU, Hyderabad for training of teachers as Master Trainers for improving Spoken English among the staff and students. 30 teachers were trained in July, 2011 and presently KVS is in the process of working out an MOU with EFLU for a continuous programme schedule.

In this regard it was advised by AAC that first of all a report should be taken of the follow up work being done by the 30 Master Trainers trained in July, 2011. Further, a programme be drawn of trainings to be conducted by them in the future.

Secondly, training programmes be scheduled with EFLU for training Master Trainers within March 2012.

Training programmes through IGNOU also need to be pursued. In this connection, Vice Chairman desired that a meeting be scheduled with Vice Chancellor, IGNOU.

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SUPPL. ITEM NO.02: DECENTRALISATION OF POWERS FOR RECRUITMENT OF SUB-STAFF IN THE KENDRIYA VIDYALAYA SANGATHAN.

The Board approved delegation of powers for recruitment of Sub-staff to the Deputy Commissioner at regional level for the vacancies available at Regional Office and Kendriya Vidyalayas under their jurisdiction.

SUPPL. ITEM NO.03: CONSTITUTION OF THE COUNCIL UNDER THE SCHEME OF JOINT CONSULTATIVE MACHINERY OF THE KVS.

This has led to litigation by the effected employees wherein the court has desired to know the clause under which such transfer was affected.

Maintenance and preparation of Annual Performance Assessment Reports-Communication of all entries for fairness and transparency in Public Administration.

Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan has adopted the Annual Performance Assessment Report (APAR) in place of erstwhile Annual Confidential Report (ACR) for its various teaching and non-teaching category of posts. Necessary circular in this aspect was issued on 29.03.2011 with the approval of the Hon'ble Chairman, KVS. Thereafter, the decision of the Hon'ble Chairman, KVS was got ratified by the BOG of KVS in its 90th meeting held on 30.08.2011. The Sangathan have implemented the instructions of Government of India in its totality in adopting new APAR system with minor changes in view of the practical requirements of the Sangathan.

While implementing the revised proformae of APAR for Group-A, Group-B, Group-C for non-teaching category posts and Proforma-D for teaching category posts the following difficulties/discrepancies have been noticed:-

a) APAR Proforma-A for Group-A Officers:

In Part-3, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan has added self assessment column no. 3 & 4 for filling up by the Officer reported upon, whereas these 02 columns were not prescribed by the Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India. Since the Part-2 of the Proforma is sufficient for submitting self assessment report thus, KVS also considers these two columns unwarranted.

The Board approved the deletion of column no. 3 & 4 from Part-3 (sub-part A, B & C) of APAR Proforma-A meant for Group-A Officers from the assessment year 2011-12.

b) <u>APAR Proforma-A (Group-A posts), Proforma- B (Group-B posts), Proforma-C (Group-C posts), & Proforma-D for Teaching Staff:</u>

In Part-4, sub-head 6 and Part 5, sub-head 4 the provision is available for Pen-Picture by Reporting Officer/ Reviewing Officer (in about 100 words) on the overall qualities of the officer. While implementing the said provision, it has been observed that in the matter of various types of teaching and non-teaching category posts in Kendriya Vidyalayas the Reviewing Officers have to fill-up the Pen-Picture of a lot of employees such as the Assistant Commissioners, of the concerned Regional Office has to fill up the Pen-Picture of more than 1000 teachers/ employees which has been observed very difficult for any Reviewing Officer to right 100 words Pen Picture for each of the officer reported upon.

The Board approved the amendment in the Pen-Picture clause of Part- 5 and B & C under APAR Proforma-A, Proforma-B, Proforma-C and Proforma-D and as under:

METHOD OF ADMISSION

A. In Class I (RTE Act 2009 – section 12(1)(c)) (See Annexure – V)

To fulfil the constitutional mandate of reservation to SC/ST and also to implement the provisions of RTE Act under Rule 12(1) c following procedure shall be adopted for admission to class I (with class strength of 41).

Step I All applications received, shall be scrutinized and separated in following bunches:-

- i) All general category candidates including disabled of the same category.
- ii) All SC candidates including disabled.
- iii) All ST candidates including disabled.
- iv) All other candidates belonging to other disadvantaged group like economically weaker sections socially weaker sections including disabled.

Step II (Admission to 25% of seats)

- (a) All applications of (ii) above shall be taken for draw of lots and 6 candidates (15%) will be selected by draw of lots.
- (b) All applications of (iii) above shall be taken for draw of lots and 3 candidates (7.5%) will be selected by draw of lots.
- (c) For remaining I seat all applications of (iv) above as well as disabled children belonging to all categories will be taken for draw of lots. Unsuccessful disabled children belonging to SC/ST category will be included in this draw of lots.

Step III Remaining 31 (75%) seats shall be filled up by KVS' own system of admission based on priority categories of employees treating all candidates as general

METHOD OF ADMISSION

A. In Class I (RTE Act 2009 – section 12(1)(c)) (Scc Annexure –V)

To fulfil the constitutional mandate of reservation to SC/ST and also to implement the provisions of RTE Act under Rule 12(1) c following procedure shall be adopted for admission to class I (with class strength of 41).

- 1. In first phase 31 seats in Class I should be filled as per existing category system in KVS irrespective of reservation. (However, 01 seat may be granted to disabled child of any category under 3% horizontal reservation)
- 2. The children secured admission in Ist phase will not be included in 2nd phase (RTE system). However, the unsuccessful candidates in Ist phase, if otherwise, eligible in RTE quota will be included in 2nd phase (RTE Quota).
- 3. In 2nd phase, the remaining 10 seats will be filled as per RTE provisions (25% of seats)
- (a) All applications of Scheduled Caste candidates will be subjected to random method (Lottery System) to select 6 candidates.
- (b) All applications of (Scheduled Tribe) candidates will be subjected to random method (Lottery System) to select 3 candidates.
- (c) All applications of Economically Weaker Section (EWS)/Below Poverty Line (BPL)/OBC (Non Creamy Layer)/Disabled Children will be subjected to random method (Lottery System) to select I candidate.

Note: If adequate number of candidates are not available in (a), (b), & (c), the admission may be granted by interchanging the above three

category candidates (unsuccessful of step II - a, b & c will also be included). Out of these 31 seats, I seat will go to disabled child of General Category as the same is due against 3% horizontal reservation. O1 candidate shall be granted admission over and above the class size to ensure that presently available 31 seats to General Category candidates remain intact.

CLASS XI ADMISSIONS:-

Fresh admissions would be made after accommodating all the eligible students of the same KV in the entitled stream and thereafter other KVs. Fresh admissions would be made after accommodating all the · eligible students of the same KV in the entitled stream and thereafter other KVs. Fresh admission for remaining vacancies would be made in order of merit in the sequence of categories of priority on the basis of the board results of class; X. Admissions in different streams for children seeking admission from KVs & non-KVs would be made on fulfilment - of the following minimum requirements:

The cut off Grade and CGPA as per CBSE documents (irrespective of scaling of the grade) for admissions in Science. Commerce & Humanities streams would be as under:

i) Science Stream

(i) Science with Mathematics

- (a) A Minimum of B1 GRADE in Maths
- (b) A Minimum of B1 GRADE in Science
- (c) A Minimum of 7.6 CGPA

(ii) Science without Maths

Science without mathematics may be allowed if the student has secured B1 GRADE in Science with at least 7.6 CGPA

iii) Commerce Stream.

- (a) A minimum of 5.4 CGPA
- (b) Mathematics can be offered with Commerce if the student has obtained a minimum of CI GRADE in Mathematics.

(iii) Humanities Stream

All students of Kendriya Vidyalayas if they are declared successful by the CBSE would be given admission. However, Humanities with mathematics can be offered if at least C1 GRADE is obtained in Mathematics.

- a) Humanities with mathematics can be offered if at least B1 GRADE is obtained in Mathematics.
- b) Humanities with Economics can be offered with minimum of 6.0 CGPA.
- c) Students who are NOT eligible/NOT opting for Economics will be offered Political Science or Sociology or Psychology.
